UNIMONT at Vette In Vista: “a degree for the mountains”

The tenth edition of "Vette in Vista": a four-day festival dedicated to the mountains to explore, live and study organized by the Stefano Zavka Association and the Italian Alpine Club of Terni in collaboration with the Trento Film Festival and the National Italian Alpine Club Cineteca was held from 25th to 28th January in the Sala dell'Orologio del Caos in Terni. The Mountain University - Edolo Campus of the University of Milan - was invited.

The appointment with UNIMONT was on Friday 26th at 5.00 p.m., during the meeting entitled “A degree for the mountains”, which explained teaching and research activities for the sustainable development and enhancement of mountain environments. The **Edolo Mountain University** and the **University of Tuscia** spoke of the new degree courses dedicated to the mountains organized at the two universities, interacting with young graduates and others, engaged in the recovery and innovation of ancient arts and trades, with the dream of working towards new life for mountain areas.

UNIMONT graduates who took part in the debate to talk about their experience in developing and enhancing the resources of the territory included Enrico dell’Osa of the Dell’Osa Farm, Marco Monopoli of Frammenti, Società Agricola Semplice, Stefania Reali of “Cosa tiene accese le Stelle” and Daniela Toloni of the VALMALZA REFUGE

On 8th January, RAI Community - L'altra Italia, the program broadcast by RAI to Italians abroad, showed the report dedicated to Unimont - University of Milan as a center of excellence active in the training of young people who will work in the mountains. RAI Community – L'altra Italia is a program dedicated to Italians living abroad whose goal is to tell and share

the excellence of Italy with those who live and work far away. UNIMONT was chosen for the section **Campus Italia** which presents the high quality training courses activated by universities and vocational schools in Italy. Dott.ssa Emanuela Zilio talked about the Unimont experience, the work done over the years in research, training, planning and communication, a commitment that has led today to **more than 250 students who live and study in Edolo** and numerous **young entrepreneurs** ready to respond to the challenges of the mountain territory, a working group active on projects at regional, national and international levels, and a network - in constant growth - active in the mountains. Dr. Luca Giupponi recounted how teaching and direct learning work in the field, the PhD student Sarah Whitaker (who arrived in Edolo from Atlanta - USA) and the student Francesco Vertua spoke of the investment and commitment of Unimont for the future of the mountains between *climate change* and sustainability.

MOUNTAIN 4.0: a future to build together

A meeting of Mountain 4.0 which aims to stimulate thought on a large-scale enhancement of mountain areas and was organized by the Municipality of Bormio, was held on Thursday, 18th January at 5.00 p.m., in the Conference Room of Bormio Terme.

Mountains are areas that require policies capable of enhancing their riches and unique characteristics. To achieve this goal it is necessary to work together, **creating a network that values innovation and sustainability through local assets**. It is therefore important to reason according to a **logic of innovation of a widespread, articulated and networking system, for an open "innovation community"** that develops by forming a **network** of relationships based on the territory but open to outside factors.

“Entrepreneurship and system innovation in the Alpine area, networks and opportunities for the mountains” is the title of the meeting to which **Anna Giorgi of UNIMONT - University of Milan, Leader of Action group 1 - EUSALP Research and Innovation** was invited to contribute on issues of networking and innovation, thanks to her academic-scientific approach together with the use of *best practices* obtained from interaction with the territory.

Enrollment open for the advanced course in Sustainable Tourism For Mountain Areas

Enrollment for the Advanced Course in Sustainable Tourism for Mountain areas opened on Thursday 11th January 2018. The course is organized by the Mountain University – Edolo Campus of the University of Milan, by the University of Eastern Piedmont and in collaboration with the University of Tuscia, as part of the project **Italian Mountain Lab Research and Innovation for the Mountain environment and territories - Special supplementary Fund for research (FISR 2016)**.

The advanced course in **Sustainable Tourism for Mountain Areas** will take place **from March to June – will last 70 hours** and aims to:

- provide the **basic tools useful for developing and enhancing business in the mountain tourism sector** and is aimed in particular at young entrepreneurs, stakeholders and institutions working in tourism in the Alpine macro-region;
- **explore, analyze and share evolution, models and examples** available in the economic, socio-cultural and natural fields related to the sector at an international level (7 Countries and 48 Regions of the EUSALP area);
- bring to the foreground **potential enabled by the use of new technologies, IT and telematics** for the promotion, organization and promotion of tourism;
- create the **conditions for possible job and professional opportunities** throughout the Macro Alpine region

ITALIAN PLANT AGRO-BIODIVERSITY

As part of the Lombardy Region project implementation, an area dedicated to agrobiodiversity has been developed. The **UNIMONT portal** has a section that provides a complete view of traditional little-known plant varieties (cereals, vegetables, fruit trees, etc.) that deserve to be characterized, valorised and protected in order to increase Italian plant agro-biodiversity and to generate supply chains of typical and quality products.

SAFFRON: 3rd TECHNICAL TABLE

The technical table on saffron represents an opportunity for all those working in the saffron production chain (farmers, restaurateurs, researchers, etc.) or who wish to be part of it to meet and share experiences. The third technical table has the aim of allowing the various stakeholders who make up the supply chain to discuss issues in order to identify strengths and weaknesses linked to the production, enhancement and sale of the spice.

Mountain cereals: selection of typical and traditional cultivar seeds

The conference presents some good practices for the selection and conservation of seeds of cereal (and pseudo-cereal) cultivars traditionally grown in the mountains of Lombardy. In particular, attention will be paid to the selection, treatment and conservation of small quantities of seeds (15 -150 kg), generally available to those who grow local cultivars. During the conference there will be a practical demonstration of the selection and treatment of the seeds to be used for the following year's crops. The conference is aimed primarily at farmers potentially interested in the cultivation of traditional and local Lombard cultivars, as well as all those who intend to create new small production chains based on such cultivars.

Local traditional mountain cereals: the milling of grains and flours

The conference will deal with various aspects related to the milling of grains of local cultivars of cereals (and pseudo-cereals) that are traditionally cultivated in the mountains of Lombardy. In particular, the various methods for milling grains will be presented and compared, and indications will be provided on the best practices to follow in order to obtain a quality product (flour). During the conference there will be a practical demonstration of milling, and the various types of flour obtainable by milling the grains of local cultivars will be presented and described. The conference is aimed primarily at farmers potentially interested in the cultivation of traditional and local Lombard cultivars, as well as all those who intend to create new small production chains based on such cultivars.


