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## NEWS HIGHLIGHTS



### Heritage of memories - learning tourism in the mountains

*Thanks to the collaboration underway in the Italian Mountain Lab - FISR project, special supplementary research fund for the Ministry of Education, University and Research (MIUR), headed by UNIMONT-University of Milan in partnership with the University of Eastern Piedmont and the University of Tuscia, there was an important conference dedicated to "learning tourism" on 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2018 at Borgomezzavalle, as part of the IV Festival dell'Immateriale.*

**Tourism is an extraordinary resource for the development of mountain areas, capable of enhancing mountain communities and combating depopulation and loss of local amenities.** New forms of tourism have been developing for some time according to principles of sustainability and responsibility which require the capitalization of cultures and the joint work of public and private stakeholders. This leads to a form of tourism that constitutes a real "learning tourism", **which brings tourists closer to nature and integrates them in the cultural dimension of a territory.**

The conference, promoted by the University of Eastern Piedmont, by the Associazione Musei d'Ossola and by the Municipality of Borgomezzavalle, is part of the Italian Mountain Lab project events and has involved three universities.

The **University of Eastern Piedmont** was represented by the Dean Cesare Emanuel, who presided the morning session; Raffaella Afferni, Antonella Capriello, Carla Ferrario with "*Heritage, communication and highlands, communication models for learning tourism*"; Cesare Emanuel, Stefania Cerutti, Luigi Gaido with "*Interaction with the territory: learning tourism in the highlands*" Guido Lingua with "*Roots and memories: understanding the specifics*" and Maria Cavaletto with "*The cultivation of hemp between tradition and modernity*". During the afternoon session, chaired by

*Roberto Barbato, Edoardo Tortarolo, Daniela Piemontino, Davide Porporato, Gianpaolo Fasino spoke about "Rediscovering and communicating mountain knowledge: a historical and ethnological reading of alpine tourist guides".*

The **University of Tuscia** was represented by Gianluca Piovesan, Stefano Poponi, Michela Picarozzi, Alessandro Ruggieri, Dean of the University of Tuscia, with a contribution regarding "*Ecotourism: strategies and opportunities for development*".

As coordinator and scientific manager of the Italian Mountain Lab project, **Anna Giorgi of UNIMONT** intervened at the conference talking about "*Italian Mountain Lab: a national project to transform the territorial and cultural resources of the mountains into added value*" while **Luca Giupponi** presented "*The botanical trail of Mount Cavallo: a UNIMONT proposal for the enhancement of the natural and cultural heritage of the Orobic Mountains*", a project that stems from the desire to promote tourism through a floristic heritage which is unique in the area.

### Summer School at Garibaldi Refuge

*As part of the Italian Mountain Lab project - FISR project, special supplementary research fund for the Ministry of Education, University and Research (MIUR), headed by UNIMONT-University of Milan in partnership with the University of Eastern Piedmont and the University of Tuscia, as part of the educational and networking activities, the first Summer School took place at the Garibaldi Refuge in Val d'Avio - Valle Camonica (BS) from 15<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> June 2018*

**Over 50 participants, including students and teachers of high schools in 10 Italian regions, winners of the first Italian School Hackathon on the Mountains, together with students and teachers of the Mountain University, took part in a training workshop in Val d'Avio, in Upper Valle Camonica.**

**From hydroelectric energy to the Great War, from Plant and Animal Biology to Climate Change:** these were just some of the educational activities which Summer School participants worked on, with the help of professionals and experts from the universities involved. An original proposal of "Education and training at high altitudes", in direct contact with the mountains and its peculiarities, **to develop and**

increase the awareness of teachers and students towards the opportunities of mountain areas on a local, regional and national scale.

Finally, also on this occasion UNIMONT promoted synergy with an international contest: during the Summer School there was also discussion about Nepal and the Himalayan environment. The next appointment with Italian mountain hackers will, in fact, be in the highlands of Nepal: an autumn mission together with colleagues of Kathmandu and Pokhara to continue the process of interaction and sharing with the communities that live in the mountains and to broaden the range of collaborations, involving all stakeholders and those interested in mountain areas.

### UNIMONT's contribution to the "Re-Search Alps" project presented at the Meeting Tip-Ocse

*The first results obtained by the RE-SEARCH ALPS project consortium, which also includes UNIMONT - University of Milan, was officially presented on 22<sup>nd</sup> June in Paris during the 51st Meeting of the TIP Working Party - OECD - "Country updates" session.*

The project, which started in July 2017, is part of the **Connecting Europe Facility Program: Telecom (CEF-TC-2016-2 - Public Open Data)** and sees the collaboration of UNIMONT - University of Milan with the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia - project leaders, the Italian (MIUR) and French (MESRI) Ministries of Education, University and Research, and the French company Sidetrade.

By June 2019, RE-SEARCH ALPS aims to **find, consolidate, synchronize and make available** for researchers and experts, policy makers and stakeholders existing data regarding the public and private Laboratories and Research Centers, active in the seven countries (IT, FR, CH, AT, SI, DE, LI) and in the 48 regions of the Alpine Region (EUSALP).

UNIMONT is actively contributing to the implementation of this important platform which **will allow users to know what laboratories and research centers deal with**, where they are located, which **excellences** distinguish them according to their field of competence as well as their **performance** (active researchers, scientific publications, acknowledgments achieved, funded European projects, patents, etc.), who the active contributors are in the

different centers and how they make that center excellent, including networks and the flows of relationships visible through their websites. Research is facilitated through the use of **semantic and multilingual search algorithms**.

### UNIMONT at a three day conference for the national digital school plan

*FUTURAcqua enlivened the city of Rieti with three days of training, innovation, experiences, workshops and shows about the Digital School and the Water Cities of the future on 7-8-9 June 2018.*

On this occasion, the mountains, too, play a particularly interesting role in launching a strategy of innovation in Italian schools and positioning the education system in the digital age. In fact, on Friday, 8<sup>th</sup> June, **Anna Giorgi of UNIMONT - Center of Excellence of the University of Milan in Edolo**, as Coordinator and scientific manager of the Italian Mountain Lab project - FISR project, special supplementary research fund for the Ministry of Education, University and Research (MIUR), intervened during the session **WATER, A MOUNTAIN OF ENERGY - Education regarding environmental heritage: accessibility, participation and digital culture**.

The Italian Mountain Lab project, set up by the Mountain University in collaboration with the University of Eastern Piedmont and the University of Tuscia, aims to promote a **training and research laboratory regarding the Italian mountains**, which also involves the awareness of Italian high schools, through the establishment of a **technological and digital platform able to build on common competences and experiences present in Italy**, overcoming physical distances.

For the whole school community and citizens in general, it was a unique opportunity to explore, deepen and live the themes of the National Plan for the Digital School #PNSD in Italy.

### UNIMONT at the 2018 Forum Alpinum

*After the Forum Alpinum 2014 "Alpine Resources. Use, valorisation and management from local to macro-regional scale", held in Darfo Boario Terme (BS) under the Italian pres-*

*idency of the International Scientific Committee for Alpine Research (ISCAR), represented by Anna Giorgi of the Mountain University - Edolo centre of the University of Milan, UNIMONT participated in the Forum Alpinum 2018.*

The Forum Alpinum is a scientific conference that promotes international cooperation for research on topics of relevance in the Alps. This year, the Forum Alpinum identified the key elements for **the use and management of water resources**, analyzing any conflicts and evaluating possible solutions.

NEMOR - Network for European Mountain Research was also presented during the Forum Alpinum on 6<sup>th</sup> June - the new European network of researchers which aims to promote research and sustainable development for mountain areas in Europe, of which **UNIMONT is among the founding members** thanks to its experience in the valorisation of mountain areas, as well as in interacting with the European and international context.

**racCONTA LA MONTAGNA: end of the first edition, new ideas for upcoming events**

*At the end of the first edition of racCONTA LA MONTAGNA, set up to remember Alida Bruni, the friend and collaborator of the Mountain University - Edolo campus of the University of Milan, UNIMONT would like to thank all the participants and the protagonists of the meetings, from the authors to the students, from the consortia to the organizers, and to give a brief report on the success of the event.*

Including the first meeting at CIME A MILAN, on 11<sup>th</sup> December, 2017, a total of seven authors met UNIMONT students, the Valle Camonica audience and all the literature and mountain lovers who connected via the virtual classroom. Our intention was to talk about books and discuss them with authors who tell of mountains without the heroism of the great ascents and an excessively athletic approach to the mountain territory, but also seeking to avoid stereotypes that become folklore, kitsch, vernacular of the good mountain man, a worker in any case marginalized by contemporary society.

We thought that the attention could, and may also for the future, be aimed above all at texts that seek new and more complex meanings regarding life in the mountains. Books related to experiencing this exceptional environment, or expressing the wonder and the states of mind

aroused by the spectacle of nature which has deteriorated or been eliminated elsewhere. Books that talk about a new mountain territory because they talk about new mountain people.

So, we started from a **philosopher of cognitive sciences** to read and comment on the "**Lezione del freddo**" by Roberto Casati. The observation and cognition of reality is the basis of any science and knowledge. The cold, and more generally the climate, is an essential paradigm for life in the mountains. Evolution and climate has determined, and does so more and more, cultures, evolutionary processes, economies, in the mountains more than elsewhere.

The second book told us about the extraordinary journey from **Trieste to Montecarlo made by Professor Marcello Duranti**: embracing the entire alpine range on foot. The dimension of walking, of slowness, allows greater observation and reflection, and if we take on this rhythm and this dimension in the mountains, new and different philosophies of life are born.

Traveling along a mountain route can also be seen as a metaphor for a journey full of difficulties not only physical but also psychological. The interesting meeting with **Francesco Vertua** and with his "**Dislesia**", interpreted the mountain as, in addition to a place and a way to overcome physical difficulties, even a climb in search of a self-difficult to create, to find or rediscover.

The route that connects two neighboring communities because situated on the same mountain, but on different sides, that history has placed in different nations, makes us understand how to walk the side of a mountain or a ravine, taking one step more to reach the other side, for human beings are aspirations greater than the mountain itself because the mountain is minerality, it is a plant life that separates, distinguishes, but in the same idea of sharing there is the human need to meet, exchange and know. This is the thesis and the development of "**La via Schener**" by **Matteo Melchiorre** and his beautiful book which has helped us understand how even historical research can be exciting.

We moved on to the Apennines, to know the "**Geografia commossa dell'Italia minore**" by **Franco Arminio**, because Italy is a territory with a prevalence of mountains from the Alps to Etna. A territory full of villages, of situations and assessing similarities and differences is

very important and decisive to understand its peculiarities.

With Pietro Maroè we understood that *“La timidezza delle chiome”* is aimed at offering trees a "bright life" and healthy existence. A book in which technical elements, life and the arborist's craft are combined with a truly special philosophy and idea of the plant world.

Finally, the book *“Di questo lavoro mi piace tutto”* by Marzia Verona told of a world where people roll up their sleeves and face difficulties every day to fulfill their dream of being a shepherd.

We therefore met figures of new mountain people:

- the **university lecturer**, a city-dweller, who sees, when about to retire, the opportunity to travel the mountains and find other and perhaps deeper roots,
- the **student** for whom the mountains and their knowledge are the environment to get to know each other and to understand and overcome problems;
- the **historian** who, following the success of his book, becomes a storyteller for tourists, with the background of an accordion along abandoned steps and paths;
- the **poet** who, as a landscaper, promotes reading to talk about the inland villages of Southern Italy accompanied by the musical instruments of his son's band;
- the 24-year-old university **student** who works in an arboriculture company with his father to look after ancient and gigantic trees;
- and the **shepherd** who, finally with a female presence, tells us about her flock, about her unconditional love for her job, and also about no less than 70 new young people under 30 who work as shepherds.

The meetings also aimed to bring together mountain literature and food and wine, so, at the end of each meeting participants were able to try some local specialities. ## CALLS, INTERNSHIPS AND JOB OPPORTUNITIES



### CIRCULAR BIO-BASED BUSINESS MODELS FOR RURAL COMMUNITIES - CE-RUR-10-2019

To promote the development of a "bio-based economy" in Europe, it is necessary to have business models that can be easily replicated in a variety of locations and contexts, with relatively low levels of investment, risk and technical complexity. Rural entrepreneurs working in the emerging field of organic activities, including farmers, forest owners, their associations and small rural businesses, should be involved. This will help diversify and revitalize the economy and create quality jobs in rural areas.

Type of action envisaged: innovative action (IA)

The action consists mainly of activities aimed at producing plans and provisions or projects for new, modified or improved products, processes or services.

For this purpose, it is possible to insert: prototyping, testing, demonstration, piloting, large-scale validation of the product and replication on the market. Projects may contain limited research and development activities.

Funding rate: 70%.

### THEMATIC NETWORKS COMPILING KNOWLEDGE READY FOR PRACTICE- RUR-15-2018-2019-2020

Despite the continued funding of scientific projects, innovative ideas and methods are not effectively used and disseminated, and research results are often not integrated into agricultural and forestry practices. It is essential to act at a European Union level to bridge this gap. The national and sectoral systems of agricultural knowledge and innovation (AKISs) are not sufficiently connected to fully respond to this challenge. More intensive cooperation between researchers, consultants and farmers/foresters is needed to stimulate exchange of knowledge in order to promote economically viable and sustainable agriculture and forestry.

Type of action envisaged: coordination and support actions (CSA)

Financing of projects consisting mainly of accompanying measures or complementary activities, such as:

- standardization;
- diffusion;
- awareness and communication;
- networking;
- coordination or support services;
- political dialogue;
- exercises and studies of mutual learning;
- networking and coordination between programs in different states.

Funding rate: 100%

## RECENT ACTIVITIES



From the Paris agreements to the new EU regulation for the inclusion of forests in the objectives for reducing greenhouse gases: opportunities and challenges for the Italian forestry sector

With the signing of the Paris Agreement in 2015, forest management has played a key role in achieving a balance between emissions and

reduction of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere, to be achieved both through a reduction in emissions related to deforestation and a strengthening of absorption related to forest management.

The new National Forest Code which has recently come into force coincides, at a European level, with the approval of the new EU regulations for the inclusion of the forestry sector in the objectives of reducing greenhouse gas emissions. The commitments envisaged by the new legislation in particular include the mandatory reporting of carbon stored in wood products, and a new way of calculating the emissions and reduction of greenhouse gases attributable to forest management, through a reference level based on the definition of previous and future management practices, the implementation of which is the sole responsibility of each individual country.

For Italy the implementation of this regulation can represent not only a challenge but also an opportunity for a further relaunch of the entire forestry production chain. For this purpose it is desirable to plan the use of forest resources specifically, with innovative analysis tools able to identify integration strategies between functions that are not only complementary, such as protection and carbon-retention, but often also competitive, such as the enhancement of wood resources and the functional recovery of the large amount of coppice areas in Italy.

#### Saffron: botanical, agronomic-productive and qualitative characteristics

The cultivation of saffron (*Crocus sativus* L.) is in continuous expansion in Lombardy and in Italy in general especially in mountain farming environments where a spice of excellent quality that can be a supplement for the income of small and medium-sized farms can be produced.

The conference presented the characteristics of saffron. In particular, aspects related to the biology of saffron and the good practices that farmers must follow to cultivate the plant and produce a high quality spice were addressed. During the conference aspects related to the world production of saffron, health characteristics and spice quality assessment (with particular reference to ISO 3632 1,2: 2010-2011) were also dealt with.

The conference is aimed primarily at farmers and/or enthusiasts who want to start cultivating saffron in the mountain areas of Lombardy and who intend to create small supply chains based on the use of this spice.

#### Saffron: health, legal and product labelling aspects

The conference highlighted the good practices and duties of small/medium farms that cultivate saffron (*Crocus sativus* L.) as regards the transformation of their product.

In addition to dealing with aspects related to the current legislation both in a national and international context, the main methods and procedures that allow small saffron producers to work guaranteeing an adequate level of health and hygiene safety for the product were described.

Special attention was given to the HACCP self-monitoring manual (Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Points), mandatory for farms that process their products. The issue of labelling was also discussed by analysing the provisions of EU Regulation 1169/2011. The conference was aimed primarily at farmers who intend to transform and sell local saffron and/or traditional Lombard cultivars, as well as all those interested in the subject.

#### CO.R.I.MONT.



Thanks to its consolidated experience in the analysis and study of complex issues concerning the mountain territory, as well as in the promotion and provision of initiatives regarding research and training, knowledge dissemination and enhancement of these areas, **UNIMONT promotes networking and the activation of Coordination of Italian Networks for the Mountains - CO.R.I.MONT. - to promote interaction between networks already active in the development of mountain areas, laying the foundations for new future alliances.**

The **Coordination of Italian Networks for the Mountains (CO.R.I.MONT.)** aims to promote dialogue, interaction and **collaboration between national networks** that deal with the development of mountain areas through research and

innovation. **Each network operates and oversees a part of the national mountain territory, so together can take care of all the Italian mountains**, putting together experiences, skills and best practices, enhancing, with a systemic and coordinated approach, interaction with the business world and that of public institutions and policy-makers, which are the three interlocutors essential for triggering innovative processes in these areas, according to the triple helix model of innovation.


