9.30-11.15 **Success factors for energy transition – smart solutions and strategies for tackling the energy crisis in the Alpine Region AGs 4, 5, 9** The current energy crisis calls for an increased engagement of the EUSALP actors with questions such as energy efficiency and energy transition. Moreover, it requires reasoning on what are success factors for a just and green energy transition at different scales. Transport accounts for one third of total energy consumption in the Alpine Region and there is huge potential for the sector to reduce energy demand and become more efficient. Smart solutions include measures to reduce mobility demand, policies that promote modal shift from road to rail and applying alternative propulsion systems. With data and digitalization as key tools, the Smart Villages approach connects the different sectors at municipal level and supports the transition of rural areas towards energy autonomy.

The Directorate-General for Structural Reform Support (DG REFORM) coordinates and provides tailor-made technical support to EU Member States, in cooperation with the relevant Commission services. The support is primarily provided through the Technical Support Instrument (TSI). The goal is to support Member States' efforts to design and implement resilience-enhancing reforms, thereby contributing to the EU's recovery from the COVID-19 crisis, improving the quality of public services and getting back on the path of sustainable and inclusive growth. In this context, the design and implementation of multi-country and multi-regional projects are among the main priorities identified for 2023. Therefore, the TSI can be seen as a strategic tool to address common challenges and respond to needs shared by EUSALP countries. The Governance and Public Administration Unit of DG REFORM will present the main elements of the TSI and provide methodological information for drafting project proposals.

10.45-13.00 Cross-border spatial planning cooperation in the Alpine region AGs 6, 4, 7, 8 In view of growing challenges in the Alpine region, such as climate change, new perspectives for the Alpine Space have recently emerged in the European context – especially through the European Green Deal objectives that permeate the EU programming period 2021-2027, the Interreg VIB Alpine Space Program and the Territorial Agenda 2030. A comprehensive approach is needed to address the major challenges in the Alpine region, such as the Joint Paper on Spatial Planning of the EUSALP, finalised in June 2022. Good cooperation between the various bodies is essential in shaping a common spatial development perspective for the entire Alpine region. The EUSALP and the Alpine Convention are trying to set a good example here. The Protocol on Spatial Planning and Sustainable Development was ratified 20 years ago as one of eight protocols of the Alpine Convention. After 20 years, it is now also a good time to take stock of what has been achieved so far and to look ahead for future develo ments and cooperation opportunities.

and... Dante Alighieri

In the summer of 2021, the Autonomous Province of Trento and the Autonomous Province of Bolzano presented their candidacy for Italy as President of the Macro strategy for the Alpine Region - EUSALP 2022.

Italy, like Europe and the world, is emerging from the pandemic great crisis and the horizon appears more serene. That year the seventh centenary of the death of Dante Alighieri was celebrated and, nationally and internationally, wide-ranging studies and cultural initiatives flourished, dedicated to a poet who is World Heritage for depth of intellect, thought and inspiration, and the ability to speak to all men beyond time.

A verse of Dante has assumed, over the centuries, a special meaning and resonance; it is the well-known verse that closes Dante's painful and dramatic journey into Hell: there, the path of hope reopens: "...and thence we came forth to see the stars again".

The prospect of regaining light, guidance, and a source of hope, once strengthened by a profound existential experience in contact with history and with renewed spiritual and moral values, made this verse the motto of the Italian Presidency EUSALP 2022.

A few months later, however, the situation evolved tragically. A terrible war has started on the borders of Europe and in the territory of the sister Macro region of Danube, at that time under the Ukrainian presidency. Almost immediately, the dramatic energy crisis added up to the inhuman tragedies and fears, which has become a source of daily concern. Pervasive anguish and an emergency for families and businesses were unleashed: this enormous tension has almost sidelined the problems of EUSALP territories whose infrastructures are, by nature, a corridor of transit on the major traffic routes; this is a fragile land and still essential in environmental terms for the rest of Europe. This land must

face the urgent challenges of mobility and sustainable growth, with the aim of becoming the first carbon free area; at the same time, it is committed to supporting research and digitization to avoid that internal areas are depopulated, and their communities lose their role and power.

What can Dante Alighieri, a man of the Middle Ages, tell us about this complex reality? How can he answer, being of a different Age, our very current - and distressing- questions? With his poetry Dante is close to us as a man in search of meaning, of human and transcendent truth; though being from a distant past, he was deeply committed in the anticipation of the future of civil and political passions and the nature of human beings. In this sense, his work encompasses the whole world, it represents an opening to and the starting point of multiple reflections - all contemporary and aimed at the Future -, not only for us, but also for those who will come after us, for all the "people of the future", the recipients to whom Dante addressed his reflections

Through some of his verses proposed by the Dante scholar Domenico De Martino, we will address issues related to the environment, the place of man in Nature, mobility, and the perspectives in society especially for young people.

We will do this with the political representatives of EUSALP because we cannot do without our ambitions to think big for our Macro-region; we believe we must do it also by thinking high, that is, applying getting inspired to fundamental and shared values. These values are the foundation and meaning of the European Union, the Heritage of Europe: the same values which were the source of inspiration of the highly poetic original thoughts and rooted in culture by Dante Alighieri.

Moderator of the Plenary session: Domenico De Martino

Domenico De Martino: since 2018 he is adjunct professor of History of Literary Criticism at the University of Pavia; from 2010 to 2019 he took on the teaching of Dante Philology at the University of Udine; from 2017 to 2019 he oversaw Italian Linguistics (Dante) at the University of Pavia. In addition to Dante studies, he deals with the History of studies and Philology. For thirty years he has had the role of Collaborator at the Accademia della Crusca; he is a member of the editorial committee of the «Studi di grammatica italiana»; since 2011 he is the Director of the Dante2021 festival in Ravenna. He is a member of the Society of Philologists of Italian Literature and of the Scientific Committee of the Primo Conti Foundation. Together with Marcello Ciccuto, he recently edited a commented and illustrated edition in 9 volumes of the Commedia, commissioned by the Italian newspaper "La Repubblica".

THE ARTISTS

CORO S.A.T.

(Sezione della Società Alpinisti Tridentini - Trento)

The S.A.T. Choir was born in Trento in 1926: the first official performance of the choir dates to May 25th of that year under the name of S.O.S.A.T. Choir which it maintained until the early thirties. In over 93 years of activity, the SAT Choir has performed about 2000 concerts in many Italian cities and in several European capitals (Paris, Berlin, Amsterdam, Brussels, Vienna, Copenhagen, Moscow, Prague etc.), in halls of great prestige; it has also performed overseas, bringing its message to Canada, the United States, Mexico, Brazil, and South Korea. Naturally, the choir has gradually renewed its members, a valuable human heritage, for reasons of age; despite the inevitable turnover, the SAT Choir continues along the path traced by the founders, keeping the sound and spirit unchanged: the sound and spirit become part of the new members through a process of assimilation inspired by a precious cultural, artistic, and human heritage.



The Palace of the Autonomous Province of Trento

The Palace of the Autonomous Province of Trento overlooks Piazza Dante, at number 15. The building was built in the XIX century to house the Imperial Hotel Trento and since 1948 it has been the headquarters of the Autonomous Province of Trento, which houses the Presidency and the proceedings of the local government.

Piazza Dante, 15 - Trento

DEPERO HALL

Was originally the magnificent dining room of the Imperial Hotel, converted into a venue for art exhibitions from the end of the 1920s; from 1948 to the 1960s it hosted the sessions of the Provincial and Regional Councils.

Between 1953 and 1956, Trentino artist Fortunato Depero (a painter, sculptor, and publicist) was commissioned to transform it into an artwork, interpreting his land in a coloured symphony combining futurism, cubism, and abstractionism. The décor is inspired by Mittel European aesthetic movements, born in the mid-19th century, which had their greatest and most mature expression in the first two decades of the 20th century, in particular with the Vienna Secession. All paintings are revisited and tempered with an Italian taste that lightens its impressiveness. The workmanship was entrusted to local craftsmen.

Ground floor of the headquarters of the Autonomous Province of Trento, Piazza Dante, 15.

FEDRIZZI ROOM

In the original design of the building, the spaces were part of the Imperial Hotel. Later, the building became the institutional headquarters of the Autonomous Province of Trento, the room is now intended for institutional and business meetings.

REMO WOLF HALL

In the original design of the building, the spaces were dedicated to the kitchens and storage rooms of the Imperial Hotel. After its restoration, the area is devoted to conference activities; it was named after Remo Wolf, an internationally renowned artist and engraver from Trentino. Born in Trento in 1912, from the 30s he engaged in the art of engraving, - his preferred technique and one that will accompany him throughout his long and intense artistic life. First floor of the official headquarters of the Autonomous Province of Trento, Piazza Dante, 15.

THE GALLERIES - Piedicastello

The Galleries are two former road tunnels that have been converted into a space dedicated primarily to history and memory, in October 2007. A place to be experienced and participated in, where the history of Trentino and its communities can be told and portrayed using the most diverse languages, promoting knowledge, and trying to arise curiosity.

The overall surface area, which exceeds 6,000 square metres, is divided into two coloured parts: one is white and the other is black.

The Black Gallery is the tunnel dedicated to impressions, it is the space of visual impact: 300 uninterrupted metres of large installations, history, and stories of great emotional impact.

The White Gallery offers spaces for events and installations. In its spaces, the emotions of the Black Tunnel are explained. The White Gallery is also a place for meetings, conferences, and temporary exhibitions.

SOCIAL THEATRE OF TRENTO

Via Paolo Oss-Mazzurana, 19 - 38122 Trento TN

Commissioned by entrepreneur Felice Mazzurana, the theatre was inaugurated on the evening of 29th May 1819 with a performance of Rossini's 'Cinderella'. Afterwards it was managed by the "Society of the theatre balconies owners," in the golden years of the late 19th century, when the Verdi's great operas were performed in Trento and Arturo Toscanini came to conduct. During the First World War, the theatre became a military warehouse. It was visited by royals in 1921. During the twenty years of Fascist rule the old "Sas" district was demolished to make way for a new square and the theatre was demolished. For 60 years the Teatro Sociale would host prose, opera, and cinema performances until 1984 when, to avoid its conversion into a department store, the Autonomous Province of Trento, at the request of the entire city, The Galleries are located in the Piedicastello district.

decided to purchase it. In 1984, for the first time, the Teatro Sociale ownership changed from being private to a provincial public theatre. The latest restoration, completed in 2000, made it a true open-air museum on the city's history for the benefit of Trento citizens.

CHURCH OF SANTA MARIA MAGGIORE, Trento

Santa Maria Maggiore is a prominent place of worship in the city of Trento; it was built at the will of Prince-Bishop Bernardo Clesio (among the most important political and religious historical figures of the 16th century) and housed the congregations of the Council of Trent. The church was built by Antonio Medaglia from Como on the model of the Mantuan Basilica of Sant'Andrea. In November 1973, Pope Paul VI elevated it to the dignity of a Minor basilica.

Buonconsiglio Castle - MARANGONERIE, Trento

Home to prince-bishops since 1255, the Buonconsiglio Castle in Trento is the most important historical-artistic monument in the region. To the ancient medieval fortress of Castelvecchio, embellished by a refined loggia, the Magno Palazzo, one of the most sumptuous Renaissance residences in Italy

THE DISTRICT OF PIEDICASTELLO

Piedicastello stands on the ancient road to the Giudicarie valleys and to Brescia. The historic district underwent major changes due to the construction of the railway line, the change of the course of the Adige River, the settlement of a well-known cement factory, and finally the construction of the ring road and motorway.

To access the district, from the Torre Vanga, cross the San Lorenzo bridge over the Adige River. This bridge was destroyed in an air raid in 1943 and rebuilt in 1948 by architect Maroni.

In medieval times, with the development of the city on the left side of the Adige River, the district remained outside the walls and was more vulnerable to fires and looting. The damages due to the fire of 1703, following the invasion of General Louis Joseph of Bourbon-Vendôme during the War of the Spanish Succession, were significant.

In the neighbourhood, particularly in Via Verruca and Via Papiria, there are workers' houses built to the end of the 19th century by the entrepreneur and politician Paolo Oss Mazzurana, inspired by the New Workers' Neighbourhood of Schio commissioned by Alessandro Rossi. Today, the houses are still used for residential purposes. An empty building, on the other hand, was assigned by the municipality to the Bruno social centre, which has been redeveloping it for cultural and social activities. was added in the 16th century.

The cement factory now known as "ex-Italcementi"[5] and was called at the time "First Trentino Domenico Frizzera Portland Cement Factory", built in the early 1900s: it represents one of the symbols of Trento's industrial archaeology. Following the closure of the plant, in 2013[6] the area was demolished and partially decontaminated. The reclamation was completed in 2018[7]. Today, only the two smokestacks remain.

In the 1970s, the district was heavily impacted by the construction of the ring road and the tunnels under "Doss Trento". From the beginning of the work and throughout its development, the construction met with strong protests from the inhabitants.

In 2007, the bypass was rerouted, freeing the neighbourhood from traffic. The original tunnels are retained and today house the Piedicastello Tunnels exhibition area.

To the north of the district is Doss Trento, a small, wooded hill that was the site of defence constructions to defend the city of Trento since Roman times. The mausoleum of Cesare Battisti is located on the top, overhanging the city.

PIAZZA DANTE - Grand Hotel

The area of Piazza Dante was originally occupied by the Adige riverbed, which course was changed in 1854-58 when the new railway network was built. The railway station was built in the square in1857, hence its original name 'Railway Station Square'. In 1875, the idea emerged to create a public park, which was designed as a promenade area.

On 11 October 1896, the Monument to Dante was inaugurated, and the square changed its name to "Piazza Dante".[3]

In 1934, the railway station was rebuilt in the rationalist style, designed by engineer and architect Angiolo Mazzoni. Between 1958 and 1965 the Palazzo della Regione was built on the eastern side, designed by Adalberto

Libera. The headquarters of the Autonomous Province of Trento overlook the square.

Since 2007, the park has undergone redevelopment and hosts social activities. The Monument to the Families was inaugurated in 2008.

PLACES OF CULTURE

Church of Sant'Apollinare - Piedicastello district

Built in the 13th century, it is dedicated to the fifth-century bishop of Ravenna, suggesting much older origins. It is extremely slender at the top, with a sloping roof in typical Nordic style with shingle roofing (small wooden planks). In 1183, Pope Lucius III decided that the nearby church of San Lorenzo should take custody of this church: ecclesiam sancti Apollinaris cum capellis suis et pertinentiis.

Civic Tower, Piazza Duomo, Trento

The Civic Tower was built in the second half of the 12th century on the remains of the Porta Veronensis, the main gate in the walls of the ancient city of Tridentum: following the plundering by the Alemanni the gate was damaged and from the 4th century, with the construction of a second city wall, it lost its role as the main entrance; it was the residence of the prince-bishop of Trento until the second half of the 13th century; at that time it was raised and a new city wall was built.

Seat of the prince-bishops since 1255, the Buonconsiglio Castle in Trento is the most important historical-artistic monument in the region. The Wine Cellar is located in the ancient Augustinian monastery dating back to the 12th century and represents not only an important historical-architectural heritage, but also a valuable testimony to the winemaking tradition of Trentino.

The Wine Cellar is still devoted to the making of a vast range of products (about thirty different wines) obtained from the harvesting and processing of grapes from the best vineyards on the estate, with the aim of offering a range of products that serve as an example and represent the entire oenological heritage of the province of Trento.
